OASIS-E?

In January of 2023 Oasis-E will reflect the changes from the Impact Act, this 2-part series will address the cognitive, mood and behavior changes. On October 6, 2014, the Improving Medicare Post-Acute Care Transformation Act (the IMPACT Act) was signed into law. The IMPACT ACT requires the reporting of standardized patient assessment data regarding quality measures and standardized patient assessment data elements (SPADEs). The ACT intends for standardized post-acute care data to improve Medicare beneficiary outcomes through shared decision making, care coordination, and enhanced discharge planning.

If it is determined there is depression or a cognitive issue clinicians must now address this. For example, if a person is very depressed how likely are they to manage a chronic co-morbidity? If cognitive testing demonstrates the individual is in the middle stage of dementia, there needs to be a caregiver to teach.

This provides both a challenge and an opportunity for your agency. Training clinicians in dementia and behavioral health will improve clinicians' confidence, consistency, and job satisfaction as well. Training leads to better performance, compliance, improved client satisfaction, improved outcomes, more referrals, and increased revenue with Value Based Purchasing.

In these 2 webinars, we will cover how to complete the required assessments and how to score correctly. Interactive case examples will be presented and reviewed throughout the training. Implications of score results, who to report to and strategies to integrate results into your care planning to provide improved outcomes will be presented.
